



Flora is fighting a life-threatening cancer



Flora is an energetic, outdoor-loving 5-year-old from East Lothian, Scotland. In January 2021, Flora was diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder. In the months that followed, Flora's parents were given the devastating news that she had high-risk neuroblastoma.

After finishing frontline treatment in August 2022 with scans showing no evidence of active disease, Flora enrolled on a clinical trial in New York. Sadly, scans in September 2023 showed that Flora's cancer had returned.

Treating relapsed neuroblastoma successfully is particularly challenging and treatment options available on the NHS are limited. The family continue to fundraise should Flora need potentially life-saving treatment to get her back into remission that is not available through the NHS.

Funds raised will go towards helping Flora and her family. If Flora no longer needs the funds or is in remission five years post the end of successful treatment, the funds will be used to support other children and families affected by neuroblastoma through Solving Kids' Cancer UK's activities. For children with high-risk neuroblastoma, like Flora, the survival rate is much lower than other childhood cancers. Upon relapse, this rate reduces even further.
